


CH BLUE BLOOD. PERIDOT II.

BLUE BLOOD is one of the rare mouse lavender - coloured Chows, of which variety I am very glad to see the number is steadily increasing. For many years Blue Blood enjoyed the distinction of being the only blue, then Mr. Temple produced one, Lady Gordon bred another, and so on, until I think today there must be at least ten of this rare and very fascinating colour. The blue Chow is hard to rear, and rarely gets over the teething. 



dog, deep red in colour Though of unknown pedigree, he has been eminently successful as a show dog, having won seven first prizes at the leading shows, the L. K. A. premiership twice, and the challenge bracelet twice in succession at Ranelagh and Holland Park. Although nearly nine years old, he is as active as a two-year-old, and enjoys nothing so much as a romp with the puppies. Blue Blood is Lady Granville Gordon's special favourite, and was bred by her. He is the son of Peridot II. and Pekin II., and was born on Oct. 12, 1893. He is

that rarest of colours in a Chow dog, a "blue" or mouse-colour, and is the winner of eight first prizes. At the last Aquarium show he was awarded by that most excellent and competent judge of Chows, Miss Manley, the much-prized honour of championship offered by the Kennel Club. Blue Blood has the distinction of being the first blue Chow ever exhibited, and his mistress is naturally delighted at his successes, and proud of her handsome pet. Though Lady Granville Gordon has been an owner and breeder of Chow Chows for twelve years, she has been an exhibitor but for the last three, and during this period has only entered her dogs for competition at the leading London shows, in which they have been most successful. Her ladyship has also had the good fortune to have bred no less than eleven blue puppies during her years of ownership of these rare dogs.
