
1898 -Picture Telegraphy featuring a chow in an English newspaper

The latest news from China was no surprise to us, for we were made acquainted with the facts by our special picture-telegraphist on the spot. We give his message above, and we append the palpably easy explanation:

## WATCHFUL ATTITUDE OF THE BRITISH FLEET.

Chinaman's attitude of graceful concession.] Germany is to hold Kiao-Chow on what is practically a long lease. [The Chow-Chow dog distinctly points to the port in question, and the meaning of the long leash by which the German figure has secured his prize is absurdly simple.] The territory thus ceded will be entirely under German influence and China relinquishes her sovereign rights over it. [This is distinctly emphasised by the position of the German, who has turned his back on the Chinaman.] The British Fleet in Chinese waters [note the willow-pattern waves] is reported to be closely watching the Russian naval movements. [Vide the British Admiral on the masthead with a telescope.]

When I first saw this amazing line drawing depicting a chow, little did I know the political messages embedded in this cartoon until I read the "explanation" by the author.
