Vases, Centuries Old, Presented To Famed Chow



Wulee Brilliantine, champion Chow of Mr. and Mrs Cecil J. A. Maibach of the Ce-nel kennels of Orange, recently was presented with two Ming vases, shown above, which were presented to him by Mrs. E. K. Lincoln of the Greenacre kennels of Vermont. The vases were made during the Ming dynasty of China sometime between 1360 and 1644, which saw the beginning of the Manchu dynasty, which lasted until 1912. The Ming dynasty is famous for its porcelains and works of art. The vases are valued at \$500 and were awarded when the Orange Chow went best of breed in 15 out of 18 shows. Presentation was made at the recent Pasadena kennel show at Brookside park. Other outstanding trophies received by the champion are shown in the picture with Wulee in the background keeping a watchful eye on a very small part of his treasured awards. The vases are included in permanent trophies he has won. A gold trophy was given him at the show by Miss Iris Holmes of Los Angeles in memory of Yuan Kee, an old-time Pacific coast Chow champion.
