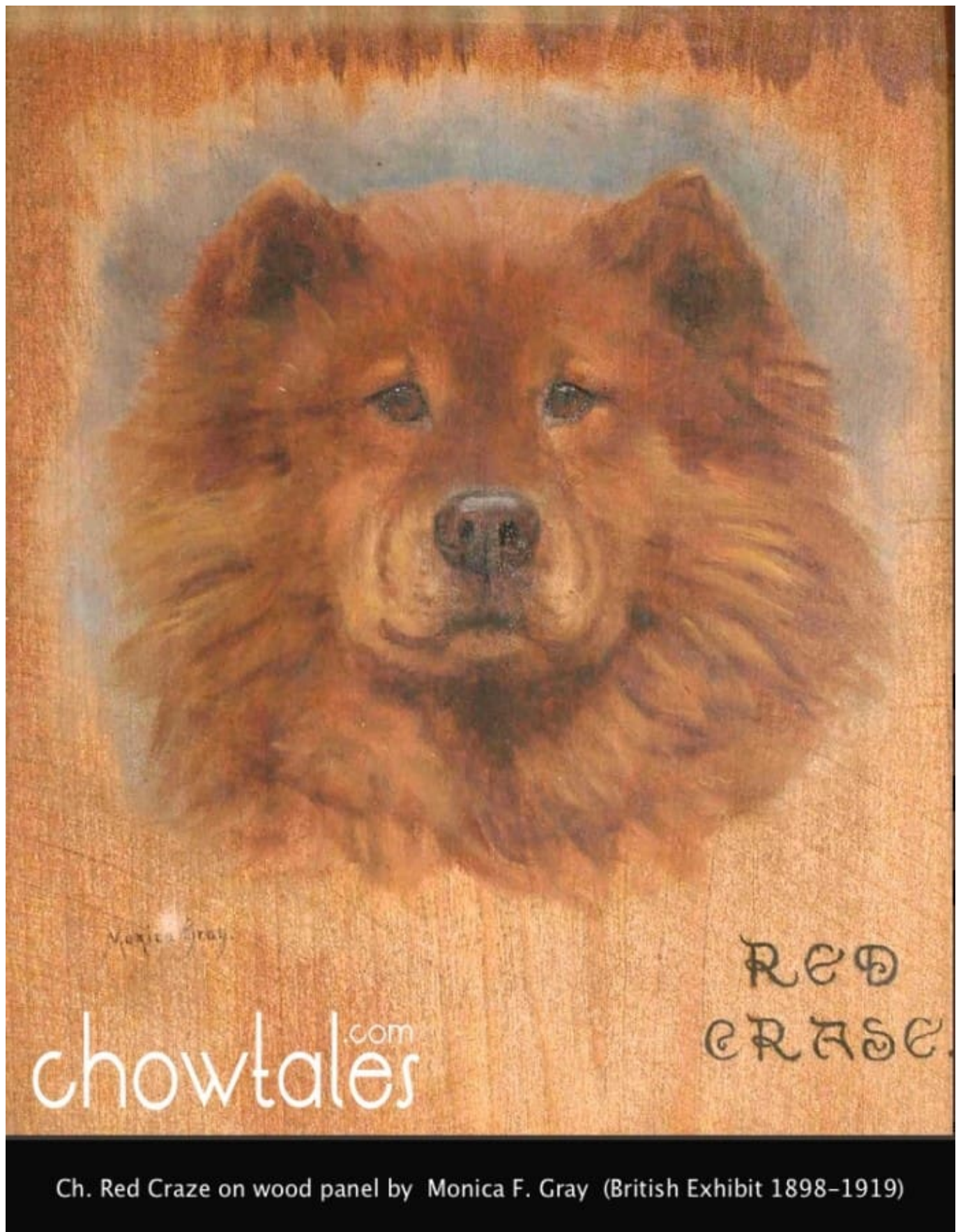

## CH. RED CRAZE HISTORICAL INFORMATION

- Breeder: Mr. Sawtell of the United Kingdom
  - Owner: Mrs. Scaramanga of Kwhy Kennels
  - From 1901 up to the first World War, Ch. Red Craze was the most influential chow.
  - Red Craze gained 30 Challenge Certificates in the U.K.
  - Crufts Best of Breed winner in 1908
  - Weight was 38 lbs. which was an average weight for an adult chow male. (30 lbs for bitches)
  - Red Craze was reportedly a rich red mahogany
  - Both his father and grandfathers were very influential in establishing early chow "type"

The real Red Craze was whelped and it is supposed, died in England.

# WRONG DOG SENT OVER FROM ENGLAND?

## New York Woman's Winnings in Pittsburgh Show Will Be Cancelled.

NEW YORK, May 7.—A scandal in the dog show world will upset some of the awards at the Pittsburgh show, and has set in motion a rigorous investigation by the English Kennel club, of the show of the Duquesne Kennel club of Western Pennsylvania, held at Pittsburgh, April 4 to 7.

Mrs. A. O. Van Heusen, of New York, brought, as she supposed, from England two Chow Chow dogs, Red Craze and Chin Lee, both noted winners in that country.

Mrs. Van Heusen won in the novice class, at the last Westminster show, the Lord Cholruondely, Lady Cholruondely and Frills, all homebirds and by Chinese Chum. For the Pittsburgh show she determined to import a brace from England.

Red Craze and Chin Lee were purchased by cable, and arrived in this country in time for the Pittsburgh show. Here Mrs. Van Heusen won right through, with her home-breds by Chinese Chum, and Red Craze won in the open class from Chin Lee, "scoring in color, expression and coat."

The week of the Pittsburgh show H. P. Vredenburg, secretary of the A. K. C., notified Mrs. Van Heusen that Red Craze had not left England. Mrs. Van Heusen then set on foot an investigation by English agents. She learned that her deputy had been swindled, and that the thieves had fled to France.

Secretary Vredenburg said the winnings at Pittsburgh of Red Craze have been canceled, and the listings of the two withdrawn.
