IT affords us much pleasure in illustrating a good dog owned by a good fancier, and this applies equally in this instance.

The justly well-known specimen, PUSAWANLI, ranks as one of the best red dogs alive to-day, fame gained solely by his merit. From the photograph here reproduced it can be gleaned by the merest tyro what a grand headed dog Pusawanli is. His immense bone, ideal body, remarkably dense coat, rare tail placement, carriage, and true Chow action invariably place him high in the prize list. Born July 16, 1924, he is wonderfully bred, his lineage including the best of to-day and the past. Sire, Ch. Pusa of Amwell; and dam, Ch. Wan Li of Amwell; surely the cream of Chowdom. Pusawanli has attended no less than 90 exhibitions up and down the country, and has only once been without a ticket, his awards totalling over 400, including ch. certificates, 21 silver cups, 23 club spoons and medals, 81 specials, 150 firsts, and 75 seconds—truly a fine score-sheet. It is further worth recording that he has been best exhibit in show and best Non-Sporting exhibit many times. At stud Pusawanli is doing remarkably well, siring splendid litters of eight, sevens, sixes, and fives, and it is not to be wondered at how fond Mr. and Mrs. Routledge are of this high-class Chow. His stud fee is six guineas.
