Koma. A home-bred, he was born in April last year, and, coming out at Crufts in February last, he won two 1sts, one 2nd, and two 3rds at that record-entry event. At Bromley, in May, he took two 1sts and the special for best dog, while he was a big money-taker at all his other outings—the City and Suburban, Kensington, L.K.A., Harpenden, and Sandy. Very massive all over, with a magnificent head, surmounted by small, tilted ears, Prince Wong has tiny eyes, a big nose and a broad muzzle, with a short, deep body, grandly boned legs, and a lovely expression. He is a proved sire of puppies which will yet do honour to his paternity.

Litter brother to Prince Wong is AH YING, another great upstanding black, of huge bone and sound colour, who took two 2nds and one 3rd at the Metropolitan and Essex Show, his only outing. SUZEE-CHE is a litter sister to these two dogs, to whom she gives away no points, while her litter of blues and reds pay effective tribute to her person and her pedigree. Mother of the many-merited trio just mentioned is the exquisitely typical YUCA KOMA, by Mahogany Bear ex Black Pansy. Her wins this year were scored at the City and Suburban, Kensington, Bromley, L.K.A., and Harpenden. A real topper this, she is, I think, the only direct descendant in this country of the famous Blue Stocking, now in America. MR. WOO, by Mim-Shi of Kang-Shi ex Hung Pao of Ting Hao, is a fine old-typed red dog, who was coming into his own at the 1924 shows when he got distemper, since when he has not been benched. He was born in October, 1923, and is another brilliant example of that outstanding Chowiness which is the favourite and unailing foothold of success. W. H.
