THE Yelwa Kennels comprise Chows and Pekingese, but the Chows play the most important part. Several well-known winning stud dogs are housed, including Yo-Ki of Yelwa, a deep red with shadings, a grandson of Ch. Peng Tse of Amwell, a winner and sire of winners. His fee is 5 guineas. Ching of Yelwa, a glorious red with shadings, grandson of Ch. Ko Ko of Kang Shi. He is sire of many winners at championship shows. His stud fee is 4 guineas. Also Su Sun of Yelwa, who is a winner every time shown. He is a good young dog and a proved sire of excellent stock. His fee is 4 guineas.

Another topping dog in the kennel is the winning Pi Chang of Yelwa, a high-class son of Yo-Ki. Chang's stud fee is 4 guineas.

Jo Ah' of Yelwa is a well-known winner. He is a light red-shaded dog with real lion head. His fee is 4 guineas. Last, but not the least, of the stud dogs, is Yang Tei Wang, a well-built son of Int. Ch. Rochow Brigadier. He is an excellent red siring beautiful puppies. His fee is also 4 guineas.

Many young puppies and bitches are for sale. The puppies are by Yo-Ki, Su Sun, Pu Chang, Jo Ah', and Jand.

A red and white Pekingese is also at stud. He is a son of the well-known Pagan Chiang. He has a perfectly flat face, black mask, lovely eyes, good skull, excellent legs and feet and topping coat. His stud fee is 2 guineas.

Dogs of all breeds are boarded. There is plenty of exercising ground apart from road exercise. Stripping and trimming is a speciality and dogs are prepared for, and handled at, shows. All fees are moderate and dogs can be collected or met at station.
