He is at stud and is siring good-quality puppies. At the time of writing, there are some useful puppies available, and with impending litters there should be no need for anyone in want of a really high-class Chow Chow to fail to fulfil their requirements at a moderate price. The past year has seen the addition of Cocker Spaniels to the kennel, and relying on the experience she has gained in the past that the essential qualifications for sound breeding is through the bitches, Mrs Coleby has purchased a lovely black bitch, Treetops Trivial, by Treetops Trivet out of Datchworth Gillian, who has already had a successful show career. Her wins to date include 4 firsts and best puppy at Cardiff, 2 firsts at Richmond, 3 firsts at Yarmouth, best puppy, reserve best of sex, 2 firsts, and best of breed at Torquay—a good start as she is only 14 months old. Another recent addition is Bazel Joan, by Don Juan of Carmay ex Bazel Oonah, and these two are to be the foundation of the new breed in this already well-known kennel. Bazel Joan has been mated to Treetops Talkie, and her puppies, due in December, should be extra good. Both dogs are well-known prize-winners.

Her Ladyship has shown You Si frequently during this year and has scored numerous firsts, two challenge certificates, and has thrice been reserve for the honour.

In the kennel at the moment are some really lovely puppies by You Si, which are about two months old.

A very successful year has been recorded, the total of wins being: 70 firsts, ten challenge certificates, and seven reserves for the C.C. at 14 shows.

The renowned bitch, Champion Pu Yi of Amwell, has won close upon 23 challenge certificates and 60 firsts during a four-years career. During 1937 she won five certificates. To see her is to admire her and memorise her as a pattern.
