THE "SILVERWAY" CHOW CHOWS

IN the limited space at our disposal it would be impossible to do full justice to this small kennel, which for many years has been one of the outposts of Chowdom in the Midlands.

CHOONAM HING YONG, purchased by Mrs. Bird in 1938, as a young puppy, is a fine upstanding dog by Ch. Choonam Hung Kwong ex Ch. Choonam Hai Che, massive in bone, short-coupled, leonine in appearance, and a potent stud force, whose offspring are stamped with quality.

WONG and PEACH OF SILVERWAY, son and daughter of the above, ex a daughter of Ch. Rochow Adjutant, are a magnificent brace of reds. Both are outstanding specimens, and brought off the "double" at the recent British Chow Chow Club event, being adjudged best of their respective sexes.

SOO-TEE OF SILVERWAY, a massive black bitch, was best bitch of that colour at Cruft's in 1939, and is a brood of the first order; she was dam of Chin Foo of Silverway, reserve for the certificate at Cruft's, 1939, now owned by Mr. Stamp. CHI-KO OF SILVERWAY is another son, out of a later litter, by Ch. Choonam Fang Yin, a heavily-boned youngster, full of promise.

Amongst the veterans, now in honourable retirement, is PAO SHAN OF SILVERWAY, a typical Mulfra dog, now eleven years old. He has over 100 awards to his credit, including many times best in show. CHOONAM MINNEE MOON is another veteran of eleven, and still going strong, a classy bitch by Li-Po, ex Ch. Choonam Prunella. T'SAN KWONG OF SILVERWAY, an excellent brood bitch by Ch. Choonam Hung Kwong, has done some big winning.

War-time conditions have naturally restricted breeding operations, but Mrs. Bird has at the present time two very promising litters which will be quite ready for new homes round about Christmastide. They are blacks and reds.

The "Limone" Chows are flourishing, although reduced in numbers since pre-war days. At stud is the well-known home-bred blue, LALIQUE OF LIMONE, fee 4 gns. He has sired many winners, and is by Ch. Chi Lo Sa of Hankow ex Blue Haze of Denstow.

Also at stud is LEONARDO OF LIMONE, the sturdy young son of Layo-Wu, fee 4 gns. This dog has many wins to his credit. Shown as a puppy in 1939, he was five times best puppy at open and championship shows, and holding his own in limit classes won his entry into the Kennel Club stud book, No. 1181 v.v.

HELEN OF LIMONE, now a great grandmother, belies her eight years, and behaves like a puppy. This beautiful bitch cannot be faulted on the points of the Chow standard, and is really typical of the breed. She has won a challenge certificate and has four times been reserve for that honour.
