The mainstays of this small collection of Chows are the two red bitches, Jo-SAN PAU-KI and her daughter, Jo-SAN RAPUNZEL. Both were retired from the ring last winter for maternal duties and both, since their re-appearance in the ring this summer, have continued to add to their total of awards.

The two additions to the kennel since last year's review are Jo-San Hamlet and Jo-San Love in a Mist. Hamlet is a bright red dog, by Ch. Sabu ex Jo-San Rapunzel, and his few outings have gained him entry into the stud book.

He was best dog under Mrs. Grice-Hutchinson at Thane open show, and best exhibit under Miss Buckley at the National Chow Club's members' show—this latter, his only appearance at a members' show. He has been retained as a stud dog and will be available to a few selected bitches when this review appears. His breeding combines the Chungking and Rochow lines and he is confidently expected to transmit the balance, legs and feet, for which he has been bred, and which have made his

sire famous. These qualities, combined with the body and front of the Jo-San bitches, should make him a worthwhile

stud proposition.

Love in a Mist is a blue bitch, by Blue Gorgon of Adel ex Jo-San Pau-Ki. She is retained to carry on the interest of this kennel in "any other colour"

Breeding plans for 1949 are as yet uncertain, but a few puppies from carefully selected matings may be available occasionally. G. M.
