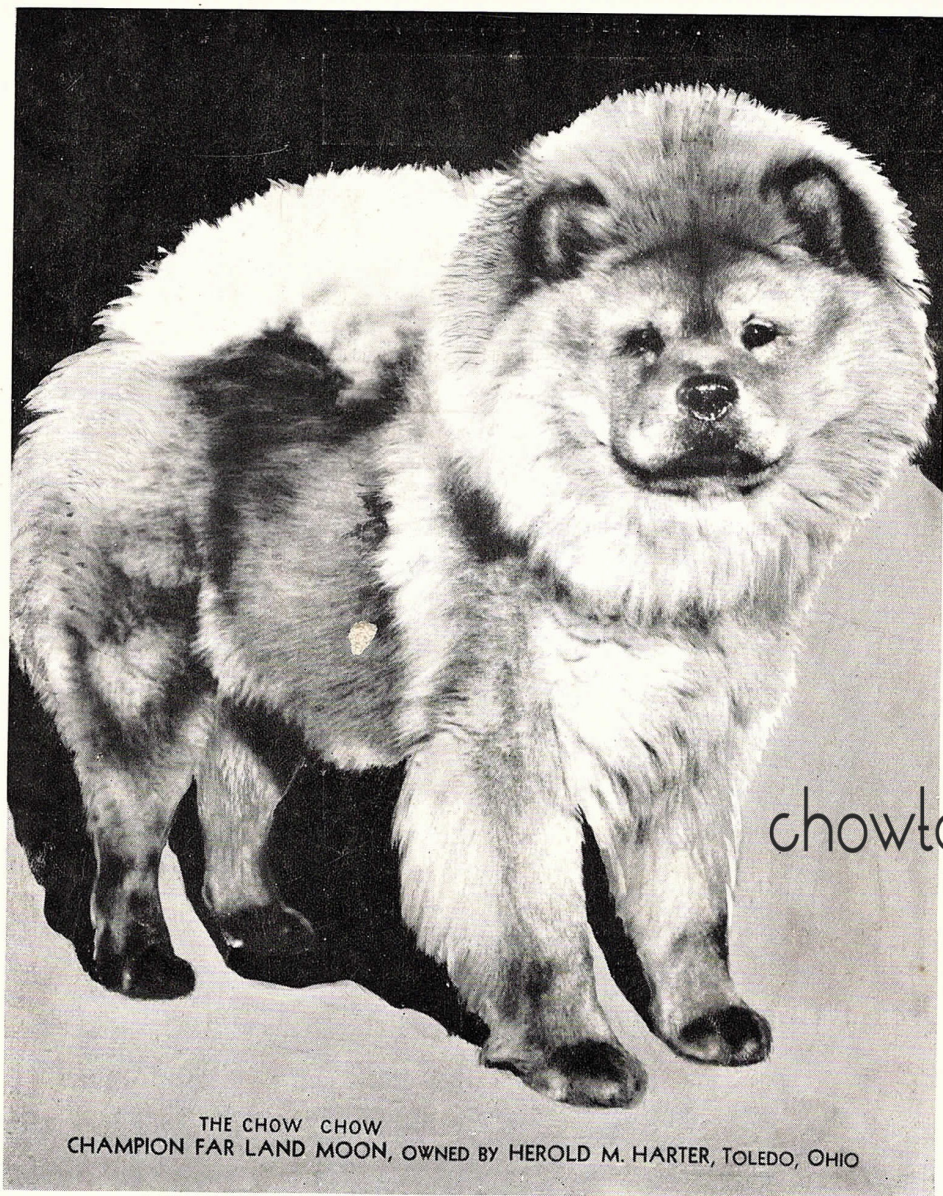

FAR LAND MOON WAS LITTERMATE TO CH. FAR LAND THUNDERGUST

CHOW CHOWS

THE Second Annual Specialty Show of the Greater Cincinnati Chow Chow Club held at the Cincinnati Zoological Gardens on September 3rd, brought out a nice entry. It was not as good as last year, due undoubtedly to the fact that the Gull Lake affair was held on the same day reducing the Chow entry for both events. However, Miss Eunice Schuler had about forty to pass on and most of the classes were quite well filled. Local breeders did exceptionally well, accounting for many class wins and for Winners Dog, Winners Bitch, Reserve Winners Bitch, Best of Winners and Best of Breed. The Winning Dog was Mrs. Bert Ray's Red Gloria's Manee, a splendid homebred by Hing Kwong out of the late Red Gloria. Reserve was Ode L. Rankin's Overlord by Manchu Prince out of De Lamar Tai Ying. Winners Bitch went to Mrs. Barney J. Houston's Shanghai Dorothy, an exceptionally outstanding bitch and a daughter of Ch. Hong Kong King out of De Lamar Califia. Reserve Winners Bitch was Mrs. Bert E. Ray's Phlee by Red Gloria's Manee out of Pao Pine. Best of Winners and Best of Breed went to Shanghai Dorothy. This was the third straight Best of Breed Win for Dorothy and was quite remarkable, considering that she was heavy in whelp. Her other Best of Breed wins were made at Rockville and Cumberland, Md. and at the Detroit event this year she was Best of Winners. She now has 13 points toward her championship.

Livingston E. Osborne, Chicago, has recently sold Love Idol, dam of the well-known East is West, to Alice Scott of Hollywood. Love Idol is a daughter of Ch. Georgette and Champion Nee Phos. She is a very beautiful red with an exceptionally good coat, splendid head and muzzle. Her former owner states he has never seen finer legs on any Chow, both as to substance, shape and action. Love Idol has been shown but little, due to the fact that Mr. Osborne ordinarily doesn't show his bitches to any great extent. She

has, however, several championship points to her credit and undoubtedly can easily finish. Before being shipped to her new owner, she was bred to Mrs. Seamer's well known Yang Fu Tang. This breeding represents a very interesting cross. Love Idol is the dam of East is West, and Yang Fu Tang is a son of Yang Fu King, the sire of East is West.

Elsa Fredericks of Berea, Ohio, writes that from her last DOG NEWS ad she sold ten puppies and two grown dogs, which is certainly splendid and doesn't sound a bit like depression. Her well-known Chun Kee IV was sold to a select kennel in Pennsylvania and Blue King went East. Miss Fredericks is grooming two male puppies for early spring events. One is by Red Victorious out of Clairedeale Frisk.

Mrs. Henchans of Indianapolis has a litter of seven puppies out of her black bitch sired by a red dog, son of Chun Kee IV, owned by Miss Fredericks.

Litter sister to this same black bitch bred to the same dog, produced three reds and three blacks. You never can tell about this color proposition.

Mrs. W. H. Roberts of Lincoln, Neb., is very enthusiastic over a litter of four bitch puppies sired by Mrs. Seamer's young dog, Ch. Yung Manchu Shang. The dam of the litter is a Sum Sultan bloodline bitch, and the puppies are an exceptionally husky lot.

THEY had a very nice Chow entry at the Peoria, Ill. show. Ernest Fahnstock's Yuan Chu of Isbell was Winners Dog, completing his title. Ode L. Rankin's Overlord was Reserve. Winners Bitch went to Ninky Poo owned by the Pierces of Chicago. Reserve went to Mrs. Barney J. Houston's Shanghai Dorothy. At Peoria, Dorothy's girlish figure suffered considerably from approaching maternity, as she is due to whelp shortly to Ch. Clairedeale Son Too.

Yang Fu Tang's win at Peoria gave him a total of 26 Best of Breeds and 15 times Winner of the Non-Sporting Group. In addition he has seven times been Best Dog in Show All Breeds. His latest triumph for this victory was at the Milwaukee Kennel Club Show. Mrs. Seamer tells us that she has just bred a remarkable Son Too daughter to Ch. Yang Fu Tang. She states that this bitch, whose name is not given, has the finest head piece she has ever seen on any bitch.

At Peoria, Mrs. Seamer was so impressed with Mrs. Houston's Shanghai Dorothy, that she contracted for a bitch puppy from the coming litter by Ch. Son Too.

Another nice bitch of Mrs. Houston's, Chua, a daughter of Ch. Clairedale Son Too out of Flame of Clairedale, has just presented her owner with five lovely red puppies, sired by Ch. Farland Moon. The mating was interesting as Chua and the Moon are half brother and sister.

The Dells Chow Kennels, Wisconsin Dells, Wisc., are delighted with a litter of five puppies sired by Ch. Yang Fu Tang. Their owners, Mr. and Mrs.

A LOVELY Chow Chow, Champion FarLand Moon, owned by Herold M. Harter, Toledo, Ohio, is pictured on our cover this month. Ch. FarLand Moon is a litter brother to Ch. FarLand Thundergust. He was out of a litter of three males, the sire being Ch. Clairedale Son Too, the dam FarLand Black Onyx. One puppy out of the litter died at the age of five months. Moon was a much favored puppy but unfortunately contracted distemper and consequently could not be shown as a puppy. During this time his brother be-

came quite famous by becoming a champion at nine months of age.

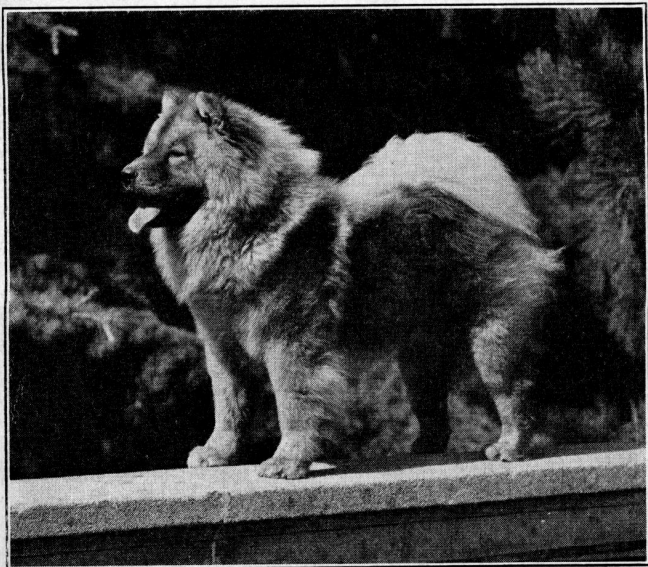
Ch. FarLand Moon completed his championship in less than three weeks between the dates of March 17th, 1933, and April 4th, 1933, in five consecutive shows and under five different judges. He was shown at Cincinnati, Ohio, Rockford, Ill., Evansville, Ind., St. Louis and at Birmingham, Ala. Was Best of Winners on all five occasions, twice Best of Breed and once Best Non-Sporting. After completing his title he was Best of Winners at Atlanta, Ga., bowing only to his brother, Ch. FarLand Thundergust for Best of Breed. At Charlotte, N. C., he was Best Non-Sporting and later repeated this win at Asheville, N. C.

Not only is Ch. Moon one of the most beautiful Chows in America, but he is also one of the best dispositioned. His handler, the well-known Col. R. L. (Dick) Davis, states he has handled thousands of dogs of all breeds and that he would classify Moon as one of the best natured of the lot. Mr. Harter states he transmits his splendid disposition to his offspring and that his puppies possess unusual bone, good heads and exceptional muzzle.

TO write about the entry of Chows at the Atlanta Kennel Club Show last April now, may be very stale news, but due to a combination of circumstances, I have put it off from month to month, and since this was the first effort of the newly organized Dixie Chow Chow Club to put the Chow in his proper light in the South, which they did by sponsoring the Chow entry here and providing a specialty Judge and a special for every class in the premium list, I do not want it to fade into history without at least a mention.

We had an entry of 27 Chows which in number was the second largest entry in the Show, being exceeded only by the Boston Terriers with 31 entered. This in itself was quite an accomplishment, for five years ago, there had never been a Chow exhibited in an Atlanta Kennel Club Show. In quality they were second to none, and the famous Ch. Far Land Thundergust, who topped the breed here, wound up as Runner-up to the Best in Show.
